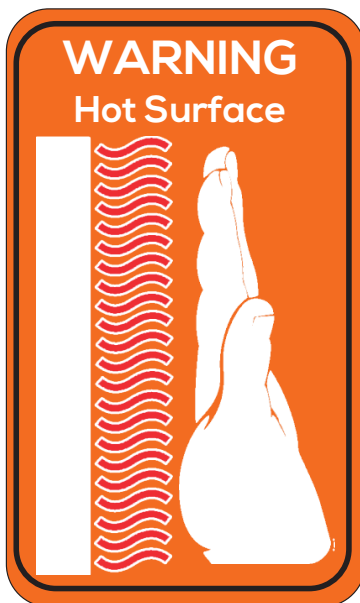

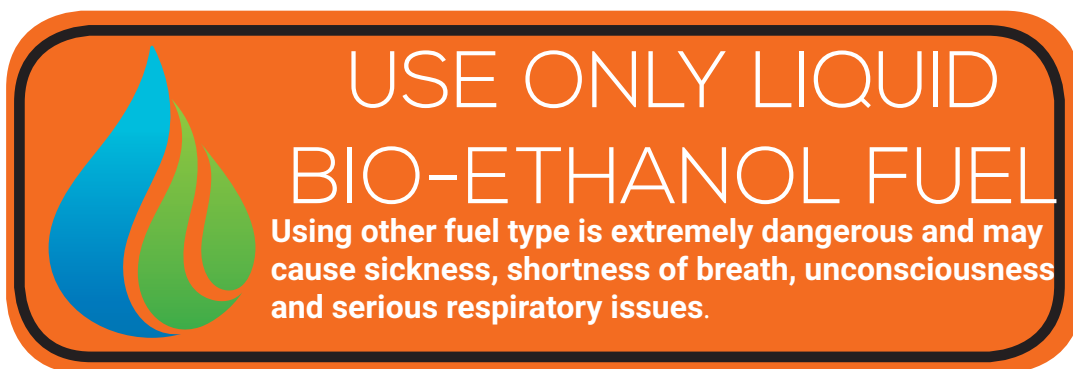

COMPONENTS

Each piece of your fire feature was carefully designed for your enjoyment and safety. To work effectively they require proper use and care. When not in use, store the pieces in a cool place to prevent damage caused by prolonged exposure to the elements. Inspect each piece before each use; if damaged, contact your dealer for replacement pieces and discontinue use until they arrive.



Snuffer

Part Number 435-0172

Place the snuffer over the hole in the fuel canister to smother the flame when fuel is not consumed. Flame will burn out naturally when all of the fuel is consumed.



Globe

Part Number 435-0173

Place on top of fuel canister to contain the flame, shelter it from wind, & provide a barrier between you and the flame. Never use without globe in place. Globe is hot when lit or immediately after flame is extinguished. Do not touch until cool.



Fuel Canister

Part Number 435-0172

Seamless design engineered to eliminate the potential for leaking fuel. Fill canister no more than halfway with bio-ethanol liquid fuel. Fire will extinguish when fuel is consumed or the snuffer is put in place.



Protective Insert

Part Number 435-0172

Permanently affixed to your spa to protect the acrylic surface from heat and accidental fuel spills that can mar the finish.

Part Number 435-0173 (1) Glass Globe



USING YOUR FIRE FEATURES

Like any other open flame, there's an element of risk associated with your fire features. Treat them with the same care and respect used when handling candles, matches, or lighters.

FUEL

- **Use only liquid Bio-Ethanol fuel. Using any other fuel type is dangerous and may cause sickness, shortness of breath, unconsciousness and serious respiratory issues.**
- Read and follow the instructions on the bottle of fuel you purchase.
- Keep fuel, spa chemicals, aerosol sprays and other combustibles in a cool, dry, well ventilated place a minimum of 20 feet from your spa
- Read the label on the fuel bottle and follow the instructions for storage and disposal of unused fuel.
- Fuel stored in a cool place may be difficult to light. Bring to room temperature before lighting.
- Never assume canister is not lit because you can't see flames. Flames may not be visible immediately after lighting or right before fuel in the canister is consumed.
- **Never smoke in or around your spa if the fuel canisters contain even trace amounts of fuel.**



Liquid bio-ethanol fuel is clean burning, smokeless, emits fewer harmful gases, toxins and odors.

FIRST AID

Fuel can be harmful or fatal if swallowed. If an accident, injury or ingestion occurs, follow the instructions on the fuel bottle. If a visit to your physician is required, take the fuel bottle with you.

HANDLE GLOBES WITH CARE!!

IF GLOBE BREAKS IN YOUR SPA, EXIT & POWER OFF IMMEDIATELY.

Wear protective gloves when removing glass.



Broken glass is invisible in water. Drain spa & allow surface to dry. Carefully remove filter basket, filters & large pieces of glass. Gently wipe the surface with a thick, damp microfiber cloth. Rinse surface and filter basket thoroughly, gently wipe surface dry to ensure all glass has been removed. Do not reuse filters; new filters must be installed when spa is refilled.



Step I

Filling & Re-Filling the Fuel Canisters



Canister must be empty, cold, clean & dry before filling

Never fill your canister more than halfway.

Filling it to the brim doesn't make the flames larger or reduce the frequency between refills. It will, however, increase the likelihood of spills and sloshing that are hazardous to you and harmful to your spa.



- Place canister on a flat, stable, surface
- Carefully pour fuel into canister
- Place canister in protective insert
- **Never smoke when handling fuel**



Never add fuel when flames are burning.



Never add fuel to warm canister or immediately after extinguishing flames.

- Check canisters for signs of cracking or corrosion before each use. Do not use if damaged.
- Do not place paper, cardboard, fabric or any other flammable material under canisters to protect surface from spills. If fuel might damage the finish, fill canisters on a different surface.
- Clean up spills immediately. Wipe canister and let fuel evaporate entirely before placing in protective canister or lighting.
- Consider using a funnel to help you avoid spilling fuel.
- Unused fuel may evaporate over time. Read the label on the fuel bottle and follow the instructions for storage and disposal of unused fuel.



Step II

Lighting & Re-Lighting

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ Light with extended wand safety lighter or long matches

Risks to Children

Children are naturally curious and fascinated with flames. Invest the time to talk to them about the risks and dangers of your fire features so they develop a healthy respect for them. Explain that just like candles or lighters, only adults are allowed to touch, fill, light and extinguish them.



- Place globe on canister before lighting
- Hold lighter or matches at arms length
- After igniting fuel, remove lighter or matches
- Leave globe in place while flames are burning
- **Never smoke when lighting fuel canister**

Never add fuel to warm canister or immediately after extinguishing flames.

- Keep hair, clothing and other flammable materials a safe distance from flames. Never place anything on top of or over flame.
- Hairspray and other hair products can be highly flammable. Wash hair thoroughly to remove hair products before lighting or sitting near flame.
- Depending on the fuel you purchased, it may take several minutes to see brightly burning flames.
- Never assume the lack of a flame means the canister isn't lit or the canister is empty. Flames may be barely visible when first lit and just before it goes out when fuel has been consumed.
- Never attempt to move while flame is burning.
- Never blow on flames or use in windy conditions. Bursts of air may cause a flare-up, increasing the potential for the flames to reach your face, hair and clothing.
- Never leave your fire features unattended while burning.
- Keep an appropriately rated fire extinguisher that's charged and ready for use close to your spa in case of an emergency.



Step III

Safely Extinguishing the Flame

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ **Flames burn out naturally when fuel is consumed**

Never assume the fire is extinguished. Don't touch or attempt to move any of the pieces immediately after extinguishing flames. Allow to cool completely before removing.



- Place snuffer inside globe over flames
- Leave in place for at least 5 minutes
- Cool completely before removing



- Always use the snuffer to extinguish the flames when fuel remains in the canister. Placing the snuffer over the opening depletes the oxygen and smothers the flame.
- Never blow on the flames. Bursts of air cause the flames to flare up.
- Never use water to put out flames. Pouring water may cause fuel and flames to spread.

Step IV

Cleaning & Care

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ **Never submerge fuel canisters in water**

- Clean after each use
- Store pieces in a dry place

- Never put fuel canisters in the dishwasher
- Over time, heat discolors stainless steel. Regular cleaning reduces discoloration.
- Never use chemicals, abrasive cleaners, steel wool or scrubbing sponges.
- Spray globes with glass cleaner, wipe clean. Alternately, globes can be cleaned in the dishwasher but never with dishes or utensils that come into contact with food.
